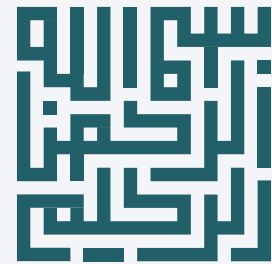




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A/ Technical Requirements

1. Coaches

The Accreditation coach card Requirements:

1.1 The fulfillment of the following requirements:

- a. Has a record of participations within the last three years.
- b. Practiced coaching for two years in equestrian clubs & academies.
- c. Passing a Coaching course accredited by the International Equestrian Federation or by academies accredited by the International Federation or the Saudi Equestrian Federation

1.2 The trainer must be medically fit.

1.3 The applicant must be at least 18 years old.

1.4 Holds a first aid course.

1.5 To be of good conduct and behavior.

1.6 Final approval for membership is made by the Saudi Equestrian Federation.





2. Facilities

- 2.1 Provide minimum (30, 60 or 100) horse shelters depending on the category (A, B or C) according to the standard specifications to ensure a healthy and appropriate environment for the horses participating in the competition, and enough space for portable boxes in Class (A) clubs when hosting international shows.
- 2.2 Provide a training field with an area of (25 x 40 meters) in accordance to the federation's requirements.
- 2.3 The training field shall follow the safety requirements in terms of sand quality and lighting.
- 2.4 Equip a mini clinic with all the necessary medication for treating the horses (Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug, diuretics, fever reducers, anti-allergic drugs, antibiotics, an anti-contraction medications, Equine Sedatives and tranquilizer, Equine sterile solutions with Nebulizer devices, wound disinfectants and antiseptics, several surgical dressings (Gauze dressing, lint, adhesive bandage, and cotton wool, and sutures materials).



2. Facilities

For a category (A) club, the following requirements must be satisfied:

Category A	Requirements
A-1	Provide minimum 100 horse shelters and pursuant to the specifications to ensure a healthy and appropriate environment for the participating horses in the competition, and enough space for portable boxes when hosting international shows.
A-2	Provide outdoor field according to the specifications certified by the International Equestrian Federation . The length is no less than 4000 meters and the width is minimum 50 meters
A-3	Provide a horse warm-up field not less than 2000 m.
A-4	Provide Ground Jury location with an adequate space that can accommodate at least ten persons, equipped with desk, computers, a timing equipment.
A-5	Provide Secretarial Office to manage the shows. It is responsible for the custody and safekeeping of horse papers and ownership documents.
A-6	Provide showjumping fences with their accessories according to the international specifications, provided that each set is not less than 18 fences. And while hosting international shows, at least two (2) sets of fences must be available.
A-7	Provide an electronic stopwatch and a display screen according to the international specifications for showjumping tournaments.
A-8	Provide a surveillance and monitoring system for horses in the facility on full time basis.
A-9	Arenas footing and materials used must be suitable for show level in order to preserve the safety of the horses.
A-10	The lighting of the arenas must be appropriate in terms of strength and spread, and the height of the light poles must not be less than 12 meters.
A-11	Equip a small clinic with all the necessary medication for treating the horse under the supervision by the designated doctor.



2. Facilities

For a category (B) club, the following requirements must be satisfied:

Category	Requirements
B	
B – 1	Provide minimum 60 horse shelters pursuant to the specifications to ensure a healthy and appropriate environment for the horses participating in the competition.
B - 2	Provide outdoor field pursuant to the specifications certified by the International Equestrian Federation. The length is no less than 4000 meters and the width is minimum 50 meters
B-3	Provide horse warm-up field not less than 1500 m.
B-4	Provide Ground Jury location with an adequate space that can accommodate at least seven persons, equipped with desk, computers, a timing equipment.
B-5	Provide Secretarial Office to manage the shows. It is responsible for the custody and safekeeping of horse papers and ownership documents.
B-6	Provide showjumping fences with their accessories according to the international specifications, provided that each set is not less than 18 fences.
B-7	Provide an electronic stopwatch and a display screen according to the international specifications for showjumping tournaments.
B-8	Arenas footing and materials used must be suitable for show level in order to preserve the safety of the horses.
B-9	The lighting of the arenas must be appropriate in terms of strength and spread, and the height of the light poles must not be less than 12 meters.
B-10	Equip a small clinic with all the necessary medication for treating the horse under the supervision by the designated doctor.



2. Facilities

For a category (C) club, the following requirements must be satisfied:

Category	Requirements
C	
C – 1	Provide minimum 30 horse shelters pursuant to the specifications to ensure a healthy and appropriate environment for the horses participating in the competition.
C – 2	Provide outdoor field pursuant to specifications certified by the International Equestrian Federation. The length is no less than 3200 meters and the width is minimum 45 meters
C - 3	Provide horse warm-up field not less than 1000 m.
C-4	Provide Ground Jury location with an adequate space that can accommodate at least five persons, equipped with desk, computers, a timing equipment.
C-5	Provide Secretarial Office to manage the shows. It is responsible for the custody and safekeeping of horse papers and ownership documents.
C-6	Provide showjumping fences with their accessories according to the international specifications, provided that each set is not less than 18 fences.
C-7	Provide an electronic stopwatch and a display screen according to the international specifications for showjumping tournaments.
C-8	Arenas footing and materials used must be suitable for show level in order to preserve the safety of the horses.
C-9	The lighting of the arenas must be appropriate in terms of strength and spread, and the height of the light poles must not be less than 12 meters.



3. Equipment

- 3.1 Showjumping fences:** Provide training fences according to the approved specifications. (non sharp and lightweight).
- 3.2 Saddle and Bridle:** Provide a specified room to store the saddle, bridle , and horse tack. Provide cleaning materials and disinfectants with appropriate shelves for storing saddles and tacks.
- 3.3 Horses Cleaning and Care tools:** All tools for cleaning and caring for horses must be provided.



*Comply with all conditions contained in the safety regulations.



4. Safety

4.1 The safety of riders: All riders belonging to the facility must be required to wear riding helmet & shoes. Protective vests (waistcoats) must be provided for young riders and they must be worn before riding horses, whether for ground training or jumping.

4.2 The Safety of the horses: The food and water provided to the horses must be kept clean and stored correctly, rubber flooring should be provided in slippery areas, sharp edges in stables and stalls should be avoided, and the entrances to stables and barns should be of appropriate width and length to allow safe entry and exit of horses.

*Comply with all conditions contained in the safety regulations.



4. Safety

4.1 Upon acceptance of the player, the player is required to submit a medical examination stating that the participant is medically fit and the club is held the full responsibility for that.

4.2 Having a certified physiotherapist for the team or a valid contract with a clinic from the Saudi Federation for Health Specialties. In the event that a specialist is available but not accredited, one can apply for accreditation by filling out the following form by the Saudi Federation for Sports Medicine (SFSM) <http://sfsm.org.sa/mos30>

4.3 First Aid - Provide first aid kit with adequate equipment as it's stipulated here <http://sfsm.org.sa/mos70> as per SFSM's minimum standards, and to have an ambulance car during games & tournaments (if available).

4.4 Fire alarm system according to the requirements of the Civil Defense

All riders, male and female, must wear full equestrian uniform in all races.



5. Competition

5.1 The Specified Regulations for national shows & races:

5.1.1 The rider is eligible to participate with a number of horses as stipulated in the conditions of each show or race.

5.1.2 Horses are not entitled to participate in more than one competition per day, except for what is stated in the conditions of each show or race.

5.1.3 Riders and horses participating in competitions must be members of the Saudi Equestrian Federation.

5.1.4 All riders must wear full equestrian uniform in all competitions.

5.2 The Specified Regulations for international shows & races :

5.2.1 The rider may participate in international shows & races after the approval of the Saudi Equestrian Federation.

5.2.2 The resident rider may participate in international shows & races held in the Kingdom after the approval of his national federation.

5.2.3 All rules and regulations of the International Federation of the Game must be adhered to.

5.3 The Saudi Arabian Olympic Committee issues the conditions and instructions regulating the internal and external participations, whether in training camps, tournaments or competitions, and circulates them to the sports federations to work in accordance with them.

B/ Administrative Requirements





6. Membership

- 6.1 The facility operates as a horse riding club only.
- 6.2 Horse riding is prohibited except after wearing equestrian clothing, including shoes and helmets.
- 6.3 All facilities must be in good condition and fit for horseback riding.
- 6.4 Qualified and certified trainers are required.
- 6.5 Suitable and safe horses should be provided for training at all levels.
- 6.6 All first aid tools and supplies must be provided.
- 6.7 The facility shall provide suitable stables in terms of space and ventilation to accommodate the horses.
- 6.8 The club is committed not to organize shows or races except after the approval of the Saudi Equestrian Federation.
- 6.9 The club is responsible for registering riders with the Saudi Equestrian Federation.
- 6.10 Agreeing to all that was stated in the booklet of basic conditions and requirements for clubs and academies.
- 6.11 The approval is made after conducting the technical inspection of the facility.
- 6.12 Requirements and Attachments: As stipulated in Nafes platform.



7. Fees

7.1 The facility management shall send an official request to issue or renew membership (letter or email).

7.2 The technical committee secretary will respond and set a date to visit the facility and provide the facility with the classification and the membership regulations.

7.3 The committee shall visit and fill out the evaluation form and prepare the technical and veterinary report with the notes recorded.

7.4 Send a notice to the facility in order to pay the fees pursuant to the specific category of the facility and attach all the required information and documents.

7.5 The facility management shall send a bond to pay the technical committee fees and register via the link to notify the secretary and the financial department.

7.6 The technical committee secretary shall issue or renew the membership and send the technical and evaluation report to finalize the administrative procedures.

8. Violations & Penalties

8.1 Competitions:

The technical committee will visit the site. The visits are scheduled as follows:

8.1.1 Three weeks prior to the International show and the Ministry Cup.

8.1.2 Thirty days prior to Federation League shows.

8.1.3 The penalty in the event of a lack of technical readiness will be as follows: withdrawal of the tournament and a fine of (100%) of the total prizes.



8. Violations & Penalties

8.2 Coaching:

After periodic visits or receiving complaint, the penalty will be determined according to the table below
